

Governor's Message: Requests related to the State of Emergency

In consideration of the infection surge since the beginning of the year, Hyogo Prefecture, along with the prefectures of Osaka and Kyoto, requested the national government on January 9 to extend the State of Emergency to these three prefectures. As a result, **Hyogo will be designated as an area subject to the State of Emergency** as of January 13. **In light of this, Hyogo requests its citizens to implement the measures below from January 14.**

I would like to ask Hyogo citizens, **young people in particular, to strongly recognize that our region is under the State of Emergency**, and do what you need to do to curb the spread of the virus and protect our lives.

Shorten business hours

- **Eating and drinking establishments are requested to stop serving alcohol by 7:00 p.m. and close by 8:00 p.m. pursuant to the relevant act¹.**
- **Facilities such as theaters, assembly facilities, sports facilities, and amusement facilities are asked to stop serving alcohol by 7:00 p.m. and close by 8:00 p.m.**
- **Be sure to thoroughly practice infection prevention measures based on each industry's guidelines. Please also put up the "infection control poster" indicating that your facility is taking proper measures and register for the "Hyogo new coronavirus tracing system."**

Avoid outings

- **All citizens are requested to avoid visits to areas under the State of Emergency and places with higher risks of infections and are strongly requested to avoid unnecessary and non-urgent outings to any place after 8:00 p.m.**
- **Ventilate rooms, and manage your health properly** by checking your temperature daily and wearing face masks.
- **If you have a fever, difficulty breathing, decrease/loss of sense of taste, or other symptoms, refrain from going out (including commuting to work or school), and immediately call and seek advice** from your family doctor.

Promote telecommuting

- **To reduce in-person interactions, please make efforts to reduce 70% of commuters** by introducing **telecommuting, video conferences** and other measures.

Requirements for holding events

- (1) The number of participants must not exceed 5,000 **and** (2) must not exceed 50% of the venue's capacity for indoor events, and enough distance must be secured among participants for outdoor events.

I would also like to express my sincere gratitude to essential workers, such as medical and social welfare workers who are protecting our health and everyday life.
